DEP Starts Statewide Surveillance of Ticks

Statewide Tick Surveillance

BANGOR - The Department of Environmental Protection is beginning a five-year environmental surveillance of ticks to assess the risk of tickborne illnesses across Pennsylvania.

The study is taking place in every county in Pennsylvania to track ticks' habitats, life stages and peak activity levels and to test them for human pathogenic diseases.

The surveillance will focus on collecting three tick species: the blacklegged tick in its immature nymphal stage, when it most often infects humans with Lyme disease, as well as human babesiosis and human granulocytic anaplasmosis; the adult American dog (Dermacentor variabilis) tick, which transmits Rocky Mountain spotted fever and tularemia; and the adult lone star (Amblyomma americanum) tick, which transmits ehrlichiosis and tularemia.

The project is being funded through the Department of Health.

The survey is taking place in every county in Pennsylvania to track ticks' habitats, life stages and peak activity levels and to test them for human pathogenic diseases. Additionally, 38 counties are conducting a specific survey of nymphal blacklegged ticks, which can transmit Lyme Disease to humans.

The spring and summer surveillance will focus on collecting three tick species: the blacklegged tick in its immature nymphal stage, when it most often infects humans with Lyme disease, as well as human babesiosis and human granulocytic anaplasmosis; the adult American dog tick, which transmits Rocky Mounted Spotted Fever and Tulameria; and adult lone star tick, which transmits Ehrlichiosis and Tularmeria.

'Rooster's' Trek

started at Blairstown Airport at about 10 that morning - was made on those skis.

All the same, by 2 p.m. sharp, Riecker and loyal trek buddies Russ Nee of Randolph and Tom Edmunds of Roxbury crossed the Delaware on the footbridge connecting Columbia, N.J., to Portland. Streaming the moments on social media, "Rooster," as he's known on the trail, crowed as he stepped off the bridge, where he was greeted by Portland Mayor Lance Prator and John Bermingham, chairman of Upper Mount Bethel Township's Board of Supervisors.

Riecker laughed as Prator asked him, "You tired?" "Of course. I'm 58 years young but I'm tired," he said. "Well, we're very proud of you doing this," Prator said.

Riecker said weather conditions along the trail were so challenging, "The only thing I didn't pull out of my quiver was the mountain bike. "I brought along snowshoes thinking I'd never wear them, but I did."

After posing for a few photos, Riecker, Nee and Edmunds were off to find a Chik-Fil-A for lunch before hiking another six miles along a trail extension that connects to the trail network within the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area. After that, it was back to Randolph.

New Hike

But not for long. Riecker, who trekked the entire 2,200-mile Appalachian Trail to raise funds for Mr. Pierson two years ago, this Friday is setting out for yet another hike promoting ALS awareness.

This time, he's tackling the 340-mile Pinhodi Trail that stretches from northeast Alabama into southwest Georgia.

He called the Liberty-Water Gap hike "just a warm up" for that trip.

In a previous interview, Riecker said he initially wanted to raise \$100,000. Now, he wants to raise \$1 million.

The financial goal itself is a long haul, as Riecker's fund raising website, Hike4Roger, shows less than \$13,000 has been collected to date.

Tourism

The Liberty-Water Gap Trail is a key component of the September 11th National Memorial Trail. When completed, it will connect the three national 9/11 memorials, from Shanksville, Pennsylvania to New York City and the Pentagon in Washington, D.C.

It will also, hopefully, help generate revenue dollars for towns along the trail, like Portland and Upper Mount Bethel Township.

"We're big on eco-tourism here," said Bermingham on Saturday.

He said Riecker's hike will also help spur interest in the township and other local towns along the Delaware, which is the natural boundary between New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Part of the national trail also runs along Morris County's Patriot's Path in Randolph, where it is incorporated into the local trail network. That overlay trail in part was made possible by Nee, who is Assistant Superintendent of Trails and Special Projects for the Morris County Parks Commission.

In his role with the commission, Nee was essential in helping to build the September 11th trail. In 2018, the September 11 National Memorial Trail Alliance, of which is he a member, awarded him the distinguished Golden Spike Award from that group for helping blaze the trail through the county.
