Minsi Lake to Receive \$125,000 LSA Grant

UPPER MT. BETHEL - Minsi Lake to receive \$125,000.00 LSA Grant for Infrastructure plans by the new caretakers of the lake 'Friends of Minsi Lake.'

Some of the groups plan is to build and install over 800 habitat structures in the lake bed this year.

Other plans include new: rest rooms, accessible kayak and fishing docks, new paved parking lots, signage, more accessible fishing from shore, picnic tables and a new bridge over the spillway so now the trail will be connected around the entire lake.

LSA grants support economic development, job training, community improvement and public interest projects through gaming funds under Act 71 of 2004. These specific grants come from Monroe County, which funds projects in Monroe and its contiguous counties.

Other Slate Belt Rising sponsors and partners include Merchants Bank of Bangor, Waste Management, Lafayette Ambassador Bank and Northampton County.

Slate Belt Rising is part of the first multi-municipal, comprehensive and economic development plan for the Slate Belt.

The new council members are Wind Gap, Pen Argyl, Bangor, East Bangor, Roseto and Portland boroughs, and Upper Mount Bethel, Lower Mount Bethel, Plainfield and Washington townships.

Other partners that will be involved are: Lehigh Valley Planning Commission; Slate Belt Rising (a Committee of the Community Action Committee of the Lehigh Valley); Northampton County; Slate Belt Chamber; Slate Belt Council of Government; Lehigh Valley Transportation Study.

This regional plan will effect about 37,000 Slate Belt residents in Northampton County. Slate Belt Rising (SBR) (a Committee of the Community Action Committee of the Lehigh Valley) received a \$45,000 grant from the state for this project.
