He also praised county Parks and Rec. Director Brian Cope for all the projects he has accomplished and is currently working on to make Northampton County the leader of greenway projects.

Copes vision is to connect multiple municipalities thru the 'Northern Tier Trail' project that he is currently working on now.

Mauser concluded with a few projects to be completed this year. "There will be a bridge constructed over the spillway making for the first time a completed trail all the way around the lake, new bathrooms, ADA compliant kayak boat launch, fishing pier, picnic tables and benches."

Mauser also mentioned the stocking of the lake. In 2020 Pa Fish an Boat stocked: 6100 EACH of large mouth bass, yellow perch, black crappie, pumpkinseed. 4150 bluegill and 45,750 golden shiners. This stocking will be repeated for the 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024 seasons.
