With their mother Jennifer's supervision, the girls were able to collect donations offered to them after helping neighbors with outside chores.


Taking their business to area merchants and purchasing items for donation, they are learning qualities of helping others and giving to the community.

Amputee and Paralyzed Veterans Pension

ProgramThe Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans Affairs is highlighting their program helping Amputee and Paralyzed Veterans Pension Program. Eligible veterans may qualify to receive \$150 per month, with 2,000 veterans currently enrolled.

Eligibility criteria:

Served in the military honorably.

Resident of Pennsylvania upon entering the military.

Suffered a service-connected injury or incurred a disease

resulting in the loss or loss of use of two or more extremities (arms/hands or legs/feet).

At least a 40 percent disability rating compensation rating or higher in each limb as determined and certified by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Pennsylvania veterans should contact their County Veterans Affairs Director in the county they reside to apply.
