school's Alumni Association. Even after the closing of the school the Alumni Association continued to gather annually until the late 1990's. Beginning in 1964 the Alumni Association established a scholarship fund to provide for an award to a former Portland School student when he or she graduated from Bangor Area High School. The first award of \$40 was presented to a member of the Class of 1965, and has continued every year since. After Portland School closed in 1969 the award was presented to a student residing in the former service of the school, namely the Borough of Portland and Upper Mount Bethel Township. Many alumni contributed to this fund, especially Mrs. Sadie Wise Stauffer, Class of 1923, who matched many of the early donations and left a legacy in her will. This fund grew to a total of \$35,000, the interest of which still supplies the award.

After many years of independence the Portland High School Alumni Scholarship Fund was brought under the umbrella of the Bangor Area Education Foundation in 2016. Soon thereafter the Fund was informed of a legacy from a former Portland School alumnus. Michael Moreken, of Drexel Hill, Pennsylvania, a former resident of Portland, named the Scholarship Fund in his will. While Moreken did not graduate from Portland High School, he did graduate from Portland Elementary School in 1948. His will provided the Scholarship Fund with just under \$400,000, which the Foundation has invested to provide a lasting scholarship in the name of Portland High School. Beginning this year, a graduating senior from Bangor Area High School will receive a scholarship of \$4000, renewable for four



years, for a total of \$16,000. In addition the original award given to a resident of Portland or Upper Mount Bethel will be continued annually with a one-time payment of \$1000.

Applications for both were made available in the Bangor Area High School Guidance Office, and were due by April 30. Collectivley 43 applications were turned into the School.
