Bangor School District Educational Foundation Sponsors Synthetic Cadaver Program

BANGOR - Despite the fact that the 2018-2019 school year is quickly coming to an end, a time of year when students have anything but visions of school work dancing in their heads, the students of Bangor Area Senior High School were hands deep into learning during a 2 day program at the end of May when they got to dissect Cyndi the SynDaver.

Cyndi the SynDaver is part of the Da Vinci Science Center's outreach program and thanks to funding from The Bangor Area School District Educational Foundation, students in 10th grade Biology classes had the opportunity to interact with a synthetic human cadaver that features complete and functional muscular, skeletal, circulatory, respiratory, gastrointestinal, and endocrine systems – all made from materials that look, feel, and respond just like live tissue; it even pulses and "breathes!"

Bangor Wins District Softball Championship

BANGOR - After a busy day at Pates Park on Friday, it was Parkland and Bangor holding the gold. The Trojans won the District 11 6A softball crown with a 6-0 win over Whitehall and the Slaters took the 5A title with a 3-2 victory over Southern Lehigh.

The championship is the second straight for Parkland and the third district title in four years for Bangor. The Slaters stopped the Spartans' run of two consecutive 5A championships with the win.

Whitehall beat Northampton in a semi-final game early Friday afternoon that was resumed after it was suspended on Thursday due to inclement weather. The Trojans pounced on

Glen Onoko Trail Improvements Could Be Possible **Through Restore PA**

CARBON COUNTY - Secretary Cindy Adams Dunn joined Governor Tom Wolf, Pennsylvania Game Commission Executive Director Bryan J. Burhans, and Senator John Yudichak at the Glen Onoko Falls Trail which closed to the public on May 1.

The group discussed how the Restore Pennsylvania proposal could help address such green infrastructure needs in the state.

"Glen Onoko Falls and other beautiful Pennsylvania locations help to drive our tourism industry and local economies, but we need the resources to invest in them," said Governor Wolf. "We must upgrade our infrastructure from our scenic trails to our small towns and big cities. Restore Pennsylvania is critical in addressing those needs."

Glen Onoko Falls at State Game Lands 141 in Lehigh Township, Carbon County, outside of Jim Thorpe, is known for waterfalls and scenic views, and the hike that leads to them. The Pennsylvania Game Commission, which owns the land, closed the trail leading to the falls on May 1 due to unsafe conditions from erosion and overuse.

Restore Pennsylvania will increase resources for new environmental projects and recreational opportunities across the state, including infrastructure and maintenance in state parks, creation, and revitalization of new local parks, and funding for new hiking, biking, and ATV trail projects.

Walk/roll Lv Event Coming June 12

ALLENTOWN - With music blaring and a drone flying overhead, people from across the region will dance in traffic at one of the region's busiest intersections in a faux protest that will almost certainly turn heads, raise eyebrows and cause a little controlled chaos.

But that's exactly what the Lehigh Valley Planning Commission and the City of Bethlehem will be going for as they try to create a safer, more connected transportation system for walkers, rollers and drivers.

On June 12, the city, the commission and more than 50 partners from across the region will be staging a sort of active transportation block party at Broad and New streets in Bethlehem. The event will include a disc jockey, flash mob dancing in traffic and lots of education designed to promote the creation of the region's first ever master plan for pedestrians, bikers and people with disabilities. Walk/RollLV, scheduled to be released by LVPC later this year, is to be a blueprint for filling the gaps in the roads, trail and transit system to provide a seamless network connecting every community in the region.
