Family Network, and we ask that food not be left outside the box if full due to animals. If box is full, please call for an appointment and we can store in the pantry.

Last year, there were 6 or 7 martins that nested or at least roosted all summer long in the west side tower & none occupied the east site tower. We know one pair successfully fledge 3 young from the west tower, which were banded by a licensed bird bander last summer. This year, we currently have 12 martins at the west tower & at least 4 at the east tower. It's worth a visit just to see & hear them carrying on at the towers!
