Preliminary Guidelines Set for Students to Return to School

PEN ARGYL - The Pennsylvania Department of Education announced new guidelines this week for elementary, secondary and post-secondary schools to reopen in the near uture. K-12 schools can begin reopening as early as July, and colleges, trade schools and other post-secondary schools can begin offerhg classes again as soon as Friday (June 5). Schools will be required to develop health and safety plans that reflect the unique needs

of local districts, including steps to protect students and staff at higher risk of severe illness, training for staff and faculty, monitoring students and staff for symptoms, developing policies and hygiene practices to protect against infection, and ensuring proper distancing of desks and seating.

All facilities are required to follow guidelines from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control specifically for child care centers. Un-

der the guidance, all staff are required to wear masks, but children and youth are not required to do so. Masks are encouraged, but not required, for older

youth in indoor or crowded settings. Additional requirements are also included for health screenings, sanitation, and notification if any staff member or child tests positive for COVID-19.



Da Vinci Science Center Awarded Competitive Grant to Support STEM Engagement During COVID-19 Pandemic

ALLENTOWN — The Da Vinci Science Center is one of 20 science centers and museums around the country selected to receive \$5,000 in support of STEM engagement during the COVID-19 pandemic from the Association of Science and Technology Centers (ASTC) and made possible by the Voya Foundation.
