When a homeowner wants a job done, most times they call a contractor or two and get quotes for whatever it is. Some jobs are pretty straightforward and there aren't 6 different ways it could be done but others may require some planning and thought bordering on engineering before just cobbling together a bunch of materials. The obvious goal is to add value to the home and also customize it in a way that makes the owner happy. The underlying goal is the 20 year rule. Whether it is a roof or a furnace or a kitchen, the job should not weaken or require a constant flow of time and money to maintain it for at least 20 years. Mechanical equipment obviously needs regular maintenance, but if water is kept out of the structure and inside the pipes, you are off to a good start.

Recently there was a news article about a deck that collapsed and one person was hurt. Connecting a deck to a house is not a new thing and it has been addressed in the building code for decades. This collapse was not a fluke in my opinion. It was probably the result of another area where trades overlap and one does not understand or care about the other ones work. The first rule of plumbing also applies to a lot of other trades, water runs downhill. Next to termites, it is one of the most intrusive and damaging things that can get inside your house. Small quantities over a long period will weaken every building material used in the construction of a home and will go undetected. But I bet if you looked at the house where the deck fell you would now see rot and water damage where the deck was attached to the house. You might think that is natural but it is not. The siding contractor is usually responsible for making a piece of flashing that would keep any water from going into that attachment area. Even if the correct fasteners were used to attach the deck to the house, water will penetrate the rim board of the house and weaken their hold.

There are lots of new fasteners and specifications for this type of construction but that piece of flashing is still very important. It would behoove all other homeowners in that development to have their deck inspected by a professional because it is likely that there are dozens of other decks that are built the same way.
