Slate Belt Heritage Center to Open For the Season

There will also be occupancy levels set for each room, since most of the rooms are quite small. A week doesn't go by without someone asking me to install a larger air conditioner than they already have. Why don't I just say OK and sell them some the biggest one that will fit in my truck? Maybe because there are more problems created by an oversized system than an undersized one. Did anyone ever actually have an undersized system? I'm not aware of one but the fear of having one is obviously in everyone's mind. What are the problems that go along with an oversized system? The biggest problem is the failure to dehumidify the air. Dehumidification is as important as cooling and they go hand in hand. The cold coil part of the system is in the fan unit inside the house. All of the house air passes over that coil and because it is below the dewpoint, the warm moist air that enters the coil leaves as cool dry air. The coil is only cold when the outdoor unit is running. That only happens when the thermostat says it's too warm in the house. If you set the thermostat at 74° and the system runs constantly to hold it there on a 95° day, your system is sized correctly and the humidity is going to be under control. If your system runs for 5 or 10 minutes and then turns off because the house is at the setpoint temperature, no more dehumidification will take place. The air was cooled too quickly but there is a lot of air in the house and most of it wasn't run through the coil because the system is oversized. Unfortunately, there is no remedy for that. Some people turn the thermostat even lower to make the system run longer and then the air is clammy and the house is too cold. I have even seen homes where a dehumidifier was installed to remove the humidity left by the air conditioner.

A larger system requires more indoor airflow so taking out one size and adding a larger size without adding a place for that additional air to go is also a death sentence for new equipment. Almost all duct systems I see are inadequate to

begin with. Let me do my job. If I make a mistake,

I will correct it at my own expense. That is my incentive not to make them. If you insist on having me do something that is wrong, I will let you know why it is wrong and then you can call someone else to build your Frankenstein monster.
