Invaders and Climate Change

HARRISBURG - How climate changes will impact invasive species could vary depending on the region, the species affected, and the particular impacts being felt; however, most invasives do well in a changing climate.

We are already seeing some influences of climate change in Pennsylvania. DCNR's Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation Plan notes that as the climate changes it will impact habitats.

New invasive species are expected to move into the commonwealth, and those already here could increase in abundance and distribution.

Be on the Lookout! Emerging Invasive Plants in Pennsylvania

Sustainability, Wildlife, Native Plants, Invasive Species

"Invasive" is a name for plant species that are not native to Pennsylvania, grow aggressively, spread quickly, and displace native vegetation.

Invasive plants are undesirable because they are difficult and costly to control; and can dominate entire habitats, making them environmentally destructive in certain situations.

Some invasive plants came to the commonwealth by accident, and others were Emerging Invasive Concerns

Pennsylvania has learned to be on the lookout for invasive plant species that are up-and-coming threats. The following plants have been identified as emerging invasive concerns to the commonwealth

These plants species were ranked for their "invasiveness" using information available from invasive species databases, scientific literature, expert opinion, and observation by the Pennsylvania Natural Heritage Program through a Wild Resource Conservation Program-funded project.

Hardy kiwi vine (Actinidia arguta), also called tara vine, is a northeast Asian native used for landscaping.

the state. Through this bill, the Y was able to secure funding from Pennsylvania casinos for the expansion of the Slate Belt Branch.

State Representative Hahn (R-Bushkill Township), shares, "The funding is generated solely by the Casinos Local Share Account, so no taxpayer dollars are directly used in supporting these grants. I sat in on discussions about the pool and gymnasium almost 20 years ago as a member of then-State Rep. Craig Dally's staff. I also remember him telling me how his father, John, talked about this plan in the late 1970s when he was mayor of Pen Argyl."

David Fagerstrom, President and CEO of the Greater Valley YMCA shares, "This is an exciting moment for our community. It took patience and years of persistence, but I'm proud to see this project come to fruition. This expansion will enable the YMCA organization to serve the residents of the Slate Belt so much better than we can now. It is exciting to think of how many thousands of people a full-facility YMCA will be able to serve once completed now and well into the future." The addition of the basketball gymnasium, pool and childcare wing will allow the Y to serve many more individuals through life-saving swim lessons, helping seniors stay active and independent, and preparing children socially and academically for success in kindergarten and their
