

Free Program on Historic Preservation hosted by Monroe County Historical Association

STROUDSBURG - The Monroe County Historical Association is pleased to announce a free program open to the public. Ms. Megan McNish, the Eastern Region Community Preservation Coordinator for the Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Office, will give a presentation titled, "National Register of Historic Places versus Local Historic Designation." The program will be held at Northampton Community College - Monroe Campus, Tannersville, in Keystone Room 201 on Tuesday, August 2, 2022, at 7:00 p.m.

'How do we preserve this historic resource?' is a question that preservationists, communities, and local advocates struggle with every day. From the National Register of Historic Places to state enabling legislation and local ordinances, the nuts and bolts of historic preservation can be difficult to navigate. While solutions to preservation challenges can be tied to individual buildings, there are protections that communities can put in place to safeguard the older and historic places and spaces that matter to them. Join the Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Office's Eastern Region Community Preservation Coordinator, Megan McNish, as she breaks down the tools for preservation in Pennsylvania, including the National Register of Historic Places and local protections for historic properties.

Megan McNish provides technical assistance to Certified Local Governments and community preservation partners. Prior to joining the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, Megan was a historic preservation planner for the City of Columbia, South Carolina where she reviewed preservation projects at the local level. A graduate of Gettysburg College, where she received her bachelor's degree in history, and West Virginia University, where she received her master's degree in public history, Megan is passionate about helping communities find ways to preserve their historic places.
