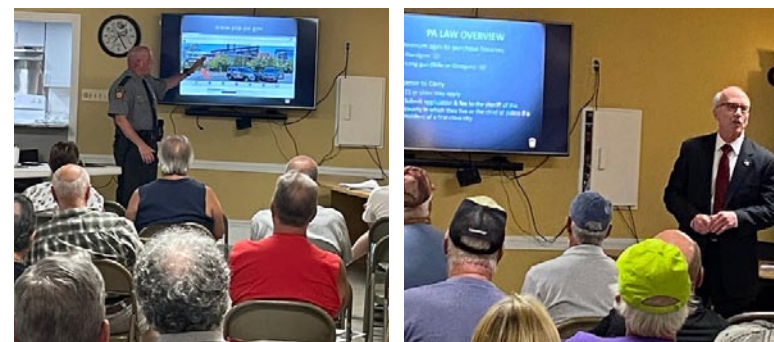

On both Saturdays, new and current students can walk into the Enrollment Center at either the Bethlehem or Monroe campus between 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. to get everything they need to be successful and stress-free this fall 2022.
