September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

EASTON - County Council approved the donation of one ton of landscaping stones at their meeting on Thursday, August 19th. Northampton County DHS thanks Bradford's Lawn Service for the donation of the stones and Hilltop Landscape Products for the free delivery.

The stones will be used to create 'kindness rocks' to raise awareness of suicide. Department of Human Services (DHS) staff and members of the Suicide Prevention Staff Force will paint the rocks and display them at DHS in September. In the future, the rocks may be displayed at one of the County parks.

"Suicidal thoughts can affect anyone, regardless of their age, gender or background," says Lamont McClure. "I formed the Suicide Prevention Task Force in Northampton County to make sure our citizens know we are here, we care and that they should never hesitate to reach out and seek help."

September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. Northampton County's Suicide Prevention Task Force is working to develop and implement strategies to reduce the risk of suicide and the stigma of mental illness through collaborative methods. Their goal is to reduce death by suicide by 20% by 2025.

Farmer's Market Coupons for Seniors

EASTON - Lamont McClure is pleased to announce the continuation of the Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Coupons worth \$24.00 are available to Northampton County residents age sixty-and-over who meet the income eligibility criteria. The coupons are available until September 30th and are distributed by the Northampton County Area Agency on Aging Department.

Each eligible senior may receive four \$6.00 coupons for a total of \$24 in SFMNP benefits during the program year. The coupons can be used to purchase Pennsylvania-grown produce at farmer's markets. Any Northampton County resident age sixty-and-over who meets income eligibility (example: \$23,828/yr. for a single person, and \$32,227 for a couple) can obtain the coupons. For married couples, both spouses may obtain coupons. The SFMNP does not include seniors who live in nursing homes, convents or residential facilities where meals are provided. Proof of age and residence must be presented by all persons wishing to receive coupons.

There will be no in-person distribution of coupons in 2021. Application forms are available on the AAA website at [https://www.northamptoncounty.org/HS/AGING/Documents/2021%20SFMNP%20application%20\(English\).pdf](https://www.northamptoncounty.org/HS/AGING/Documents/2021%20SFMNP%20application%20(English).pdf)

Seniors may only receive coupons once during the program, which runs from June 1, 2021 until November 30, 2021.
