Let Them Play...and Let Families In

NAZARETH - Yesterday, I stood alongside my colleagues urging the governor to sign House Bill 2787 into law. Last week, the House and Senate passed this legislation with strong bipartisan support.

From my time as a student athlete the memories I have of my parents meeting me outside the locker room after every game--win or lose--are some of my most cherished. As the father of two daughters who are also student athletes, I share the desire of parents across Pennsylvania to be there in support of our children. This is more than just about sports. This is about moments and opportunities that are finite and irreplaceable that once they are lost can never be recovered or recreated.

This bill would grant the governing authority of a school entity the exclusive authority to determine whether to hold school sports and extracurricular activities in-person during the 2020-21 school year. School officials would be responsible for establishing safety protocols for permitting visitors and spectators to attend sports and in-person extracurricular activities; limits on gatherings for indoor and outdoor sports and in-person extracurricular activities to ensure social distancing; protocols for sports consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Considerations for Youth Sports; and methods of ensuring that social distancing and other safety measures are in place for students, staff

Should this legislation be vetoed, House Majority Leader Kerry Benninghoff (R-Centre) has pledged to hold an override vote. The measure passed 155-47 in the House and 39-11 in the Senate, both of which represent enough votes to successfully override if members do not change their minds.

Ballot-on-Demand Voting Now Available In Northampton County

EASTON - The Northampton County Elections Office announces that Ballot-on-Demand voting for the General Election is available at the Government Center, 669 Washington Street, Easton, PA 18042 from now until October 27, 2020. The Elections Office is open Monday through Friday from 8:30AM – 4:30PM. Extended hours will be available beginning October 1st: Monday through Friday from 8:30AM 8:00PM and on Saturday from 8:00AM – 12:00 Noon.

Residents of Northampton County who are eligible to vote can come to the Elections Office, register if they have not already, fill out a ballot application, vote and turn it in. Showing ID is required before receiving your ballot.

Registered voters who have already applied for a mail-in ballot are not eligible to get a Ballot-on-Demand and must wait to receive their ballot in the mail. The Elections Office expects to begin mailing ballots out at the end of September.
