BANGOR - The Bangor Class of 69' Reunion committee presented a check for \$2000 to the Dir. of Slater Family Network Bridget Pruit this past week.



tired building without the need for new construction. We commend you for providing the highest quality education for our area families" Said State Senator Mario Scavello.

The Upper Mount Bethel Township school has been under construction for the last year. Walls, floors and ceilings were renovated, technological enhancements were installed and the school was redesigned with a color-coded system.

Interactive projectors have been installed in every classroom, wireless internet connectivity is available now throughout the school and the district has purchased iPads and other personal technology devices for students.

Movable partition walls, have been replaced with solid walls to accomodate new wiring for the HVAC and electrical systems that have been overhauled at the school.

The school was originally built in 1967 and expanded in 1990 to include additional classrooms, a gymnasium and a library.
