With new technologies come new ways scammers are trying to steal our money. Peer-to-Peer (P2P) money sending apps – Zelle, Venmo, PayPal and the like – are popular ways for friends to send money back and forth. Unfortunately, scammers are using the same technology to receive payment from individuals they deceive into believing they owe money. These platforms have fewer consumer protections than other forms of payment. Use caution when sending money to people you do not know and watch out if a stranger insists on paying you via P2P apps.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

BUSHKILL TWSP. - Earlier this week, we at the Capitol observed a powerful sight, as the building's iconic fountain was dyed pink in recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. The pink fountain served to honor all those who have fought against the disease and those who are still fighting it today.

The Pennsylvania Department of Health reports that 37 women are diagnosed with breast cancer in our state every single day. This year alone, more than 12,000 women will be diagnosed with the disease, and 2,000 of them will die from it.

In light of these figures, it cannot be emphasized enough how important regular screenings and mammograms are for early detection. While these detection methods cannot prevent cancer, they are instrumental to finding breast cancer early on while it is easier to treat.

The Department of Health is also highlighting the Pennsylvania Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, which is a free early detection program funded through a grant from the Centers for Disease Control. Under this program, free services like mammograms, pap tests and follow-up tests for abnormal screening results are available for eligible participants.

We know that the risk of breast cancer increases with age, which is why it is so important for women between over 40 to seek out yearly mammograms and cancer screenings—they can save your life.

WARREN COUNTY - The Warren County Community College Trustee Search Committee is seeking persons interested in serving as Trustees of the Warren County Community College.

Applicants shall have been residents of Warren County for at least four years, and cannot currently hold any elected public office or be employed by Warren County or Warren County Community College.

College trustees must be available approximately 20 hours per month. Trustee duties include: fiscal and operational oversight of the institution; setting policies and procedures to be implemented by the college administration; evaluation of the college president and appointment of other staff; determination of the educational curriculum and programs consistent with the institution's mission; development and approval of master planning concepts; and preparation of reports to New Jersey Higher Education, the Board of Chosen Freeholders and the community in general.

Interested applicants are required to submit resumes, a letter outlining their interest and ability to fulfill the role of WCCC trustee, and any other pertinent material by Wednesday, October 30, 2019.
