Paving the Lot helps 500 Families a Month

BANGOR - Pastor Frank Pons from Mission of Love Food Bank and Pantry has received a donation towards paving part of the parking lot for the Food Bank.

The lot has some drainage problems and gets bad ruts when it rains especially the front entrance. "We feed 500 families a month, and that's alot of car traffic" said Pons.

"Our friends at Hallet Paving have offered to donate to the paving project that we are currently fund raising for, but we still need more funds to complete the project."

The paving project is 50% complete and after Hallet's donation needs about \$3500 to pay for it in full. "It's the

first big step to paving the entire lot, we will need an additional \$6000 to finish the entire project."

The paving not only solves the car traffic issue but also the forklift problem. With a donation of \$10,000 from Waste Management and community donations of \$5000 in 2018 the food bank was able to purchase and outdoor 40' X 8' freezer container. In 2019 Green Knights Economic Development Corp. donated \$3000 for the purchase of an outdoor 40' X 8' container for dry goods.

Both of these containers need the use of a forklift to load and unload pallets of food. The paving makes a smooth surface to operate on in all weather conditions especially the winter.
