

Pen Argyl High School sets a new goal for their 2021 Stuff the Bus event

PEN ARGYL - The Pen Argyl Area High School's students and staff are preparing for another productive year of Stuff the Bus. The school's Knights' Order team received a full-sized bus this year from Brandywine Bus Company after an overwhelming donation response last year. They are hoping to continue that response to fill the entire bus and donate it all to Families First, a nonprofit organization that assists low-income families in the school district. Donations will be collected in the Pen Argyl High School parking lot from November 1st to November 19th between 7:00am and 7:30am and again between 2:30pm and 2:45pm during the weekdays. Donation boxes will also be set up at Waste Management and Woodstone Country Club for collections during their operating hours.

Suggested donations would include canned goods (such as fruits or vegetables), stuffing, instant mashed potatoes, gravy mix, and other non-perishable items like cereal, oatmeal, soups, etc. The group is also in need of paper products, gloves, hats, gift cards for meals, and turkeys. To put it simply, all items are appreciated!

Partnering with Families First, these items will benefit over 100 families within the school district if the goal is met. Last year, 98 families benefited from the support and kindness of the community, staff, and students. Over 7,000 items were collected last year, with all families even benefitting beyond Thanksgiving dinner with extra food like breakfast and lunch items. Household Document Shredding Event

EASTON - Lamont McClure and the Department of Public Works will hold a Household Document Shredding event for Northampton County residents only on Saturday, November 6th from 10:00AM – 12:00PM at the Department of Human Services building at 2801 Emrick Blvd.

Participants are requested not to arrive before the 10AM starting time as to avoid

causing traffic problems.

Document shredding will be first come, first served. Residents are limited to three boxes or bags per vehicle with a twenty-five pound weight limit per box or bag. Accepted items include accounting records, cancelled checks, pay stubs, financial statements, investment transactions, legal documents, medical records, tax forms, etc. Unacceptable materials include junk mail, magazines, catalogs, photographs, negatives and X-rays. Staples, paper clips, rubber bands and folders are okay. Ring binders, metal strips, and plastic sheet protectors or coverings will be refused.
