Ellis Island: Immigration that Built America

TOBYHANNA TOWNSHIP - Ellis Island in New York Bay was the gateway for over 12 million immigrants from 1892 to 1954. This year is the 65th anniversary of its closing. On Thursday, November 14

Dr. Brian Alnutt will present this program to the Historical Association of Tobyhanna Township (HATT).

Dr. Alnutt will present the overall environment of immigration beginning in the mid-1870s, from where they originated and where they settled. He will discuss the treatment of immigrants at Ellis Island and predecessor locations such as Castle Garden NY and West Coast locations receiving Asian immigrants. The changing attitudes of America towards immigration and the immigrants themselves will also be examined.

Brian Alnutt, Ph.D., returns for his eighth year at HATT as one of our most popular speakers. He is a Professor of History at Northampton Community College. His personal focus is on North American history of the late 19th to mid-20th century. A native of Philadelphia and Southern New Jersey, he has lived the Lehigh Valley for over 30 years.

This HATT program is being held at 5:30 PM at the Clymer Library, located at 115 Firehouse Road in Pocono Pines, 18350. The meeting is open to the public and is free of charge.
