"I'm Guilty Of Living Too Long"

HARRISBURG - Last week Senator Mario Scavello offered formal remarks on the Pennsylvania Senate floor urging his Senate and House colleagues to act on school property tax reform. Mr. President, today I rise to speak on an issue that is of critical importance to the constituents of my home communities in Monroe and Northampton Counties – the issue of school property tax reform.

For years, there has been much discussion in this legislative body about how to reform and make fair the burdensome and outdated school property tax. All too often, this issue gets buried in discussions about a host of high-profile topics – including pension reform, charter schools, fair education funding and others – and these issues are certainly all worthy of discussion and much-needed action.

However, these issues are often used as an excuse to ignore the very real, very pressing and, in some cases, very deadly issue of school property tax reform. You may wonder why I used the term "deadly."

Well, in my district, we have the highest school property tax burden of any region of the state. We have seniors who are pinching what pennies they have and choosing between whether to buy their food and medication, or whether to pay their school taxes. We have widows who, after the death of their spouse, had their social security income slashed in half. Now they're trying to live on \$1,200 per month and cannot make ends meet. Their home is paid off, but they've had 300, 400 or even 500% school property tax increases over the last couple decades.

One woman who could no longer afford her school tax told me, "I'm guilty of living too long." Another resident told me how he came to his neighbor's rescue. His elderly neighbor could no longer afford the school property tax on his home and shut himself in his garage with his car running in order to try and take his own life. The gentleman I spoke with said he found the man and was able to pull him out of the garage before he died.

This is how deadly the continued inaction on school property tax reform has become. Another incident happened in Monroe County not too long ago where a man facing tax sale of his long-time family home barricaded himself in his home and had a standoff with police before committing suicide in his house. These scenarios are truly heart-breaking.

Every day I receive calls at my office asking when the Legislature is going to act on school property tax reform. Since the early 2000s, this body has been talking about school property tax reform in the form of Senate Bill 76 and House Bill 76, known as "The Property Tax Independence Act." I have been and continue to be a co-sponsor of SB 76.

For 15 years, I have authored and co-sponsored numerous bills to provide relief to our property owners around the state to no avail. While my district was the fastest growing region in the State, we did not receive fair funding in line with the population growth we experienced. And that lack of funding has caused long-lasting and far-reaching consequences for our communities – and other communities across the state.

I am calling on my colleagues in the Senate and House today to DO SOMETHING. I have had enough talk. We know the possibilities and it's time to act to provide relief where it is needed most. Today, my priority remains with our seniors and those on fixed income living in our Commonwealth. If we cannot muster the votes for a comprehensive elimination package and the 15-year school property tax reform stalemate continues, then we MUST do something to help our seniors. Seniors who have paid their fair share for decades, who haven't had children in school for years and who have struggled to make ends meet in the wake of the death of a spouse.

I have run the numbers. A one half percent increase in the State Sales tax would wipe out school property taxes for a majority of seniors within the Commonwealth. And you know the nice thing about the sales tax? 30% is paid by non-residents. And a small sales tax increase is a fairer, simpler and more affordable solution than our current situation where our seniors are shackled to their homes as they watch their retirement savings disappear with the ever-increasing school property tax.

While full elimination of school property taxes remains a goal, we CANNOT allow inaction on reform to continue to prevent us from taking care of our seniors. Because, when a senior leaves a house, you know what happens? They are often replaced by a family with children – children who cost our school districts to educate. I can point out areas within my District where many seniors used to reside, but that have now moved on or lost their homes to their high school property taxes.

Mr. President, today I call on my colleagues to join me in pushing this issue forward, to develop real action. After two decades of "conversations" and "studies" and "commissions" and "working groups," it's time to see REAL ACTION. Thank you, Mr. President.
