**COVID-19 Drive-through** vaccination and testing center Lamont McClure and Lehigh Valley Hospital-Coordinated Health Allentown Hospital (LVH-CHA) remind Northampton County residents that the drivethrough center at 3100 Emrick Blvd. in Bethlehem Township offers both testing for COVID-19 and vaccinations. Hours of operation are Monday/Wednesday/Friday from 10:00AM - 2:00PM and Tuesday/Thursday from 2:00PM - 6:00PM. Vaccinations are by appointment only and are only available for Northampton County residents ages twelve and over. Patients can choose

from all three available vaccines: Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson. Pfizer and Moderna require two shots administered three weeks apart,

Johnson and Johnson requires only one dose. "Recent infection data shows the pandemic isn't over yet," says Lamont McClure. "I encourage everyone to get vaccinated and, if you begin showing symptoms, to get tested for COVID-19. Vaccines and testing offer us the best chance of decreasing the risks from

this virus." To make an appointment for a vaccine at the COVID-19 testing site

Call 833-584-6283 (833-LVHN-CVD). The COVID-19 Vaccine Hotline is open Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m. and Saturday-Sunday 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

A Physician's order is not required for a COVID-19 test. The drive-through site is open to everyone, but only residents of Northampton County will have the cost of testing covered by the County if they do not have health coverage. All testing will be through HNL Lab Medicine unless insurance requires an alternate laboratory. Participants should bring a photo ID and their insurance card, if they have one, with them to the testing site

#### **Sherman Theater**

Multi-Platinum Rockers HINDER to Play Sherman Theater on October 29

The Sherman Theater on Main Street in Stroudsburg announced that Hinder will be appearing on Friday, October 29 at 8:00 PM.

Multi-platinum American rockers, HIN-DER, continue to drive a career of longevity that few bands achieve. HINDER began crafting raucous post-grunge music in the early 2000s, when Oklahoma City guitarist Joe Garvey and drummer

Cody Hanson found Austin Winkler singing cover songs at a college party. The three formed the nucleus of HIN-DER and the group started landing local gigs opening for bands such as Theory of a Deadman. Soon guitarist Mark King and bassist Mike Rodden were brought into the fold.

As one of the few rock bands to grab massiver cross-over success, HIN-DER's 2005 full-length debut album, Extreme Behavior, became one of the year's most popular albums, climbing to triple-platinum status and sending "Lips of an Angel" to number three on the singles charts. HINDER returned several years later with a second batch of party anthems entitled Take It To The Limit. Winkler left HINDER in 2013 and was replaced by Marshal Dutton in 2015. His first album with the band was When the Smoke Clears, followed by Stripped in 2016 and The Reign in 2017.
